Access for the disabled


The Parish Centre Entrance is the preferred entrance for wheelchair users, and there is a disabled parking space near this entrance. Portable wheelchair ramps (kept at back of church) are available for those entering by the main West Door.

Our main service is at 10.45 am. We are able to cater for children at this service. Our 9.00 am communion service is quieter and more meditative.



Welcome to our 10.45 am service. Thank you for joining us today. We want you to enjoy being with us. This leaflet is designed to answer any questions you may have about your visit.



I have children with me and need to know what facilities are available for them.

If it is an **All-Age Service** (normally the third Sunday of the month) the children stay in the church for the whole service. On other Sundays they have their own sessions and leave halfway through. This is made clear by the Leader of the Service.

Crèche is for children up to age 3. To find the creche, go through the double doors on the right of the church as you face the front. The crèche is the first large room on your right (the Beckingham room). It is available and is staffed from the time the children leave the service. It is not staffed during All Age Services, but the room is set up with toys, and parents are welcome to take their children there at any time if they wish. However, please do not worry that a little unavoidable noise is going to cause too much of a problem.

Sparklers are children aged 3 to 6 and they meet in the small coffee lounge. **Flames** are aged 7 to 10 and meet in the right-hand side of the main hall (which is divided by a partition). When the children go out to their groups the Sparklers and Flames all start together in the main hall.

Ignite (10 – 14 years) leave the service just prior to the sermon for their own session.

Please note – all the staff involved in our children's work have been appointed within our safe recruitment policy.

Where are the loos?

The loos are situated in the corridor between the main Church building and the Parish Centre. As you face the front of the church, head towards the double doors on your right. They are in just ahead by the car park entrance. Baby changing facilities and facilities for the disabled are also in this area.

How will I know the programme of events in the service today?

Don't worry. It will all be perfectly clear! We use the screens for hymns and responses etc. But please make sure you sit where you can see a screen. The congregation will make it clear when you stand or sit. Basically, we stand for hymns and sit for almost everything else.

How long will the service last?

Our 10.45 am services normally finishes around noon, but the All-Age Service (normally the third Sunday of the month) is shorter, usually ending at around 11.45 am.

Can I take communion?

We hold communion on the second Sunday every month in the 10.45 am service. (and every Sunday at our 9 am service). We welcome any who normally take communion in their home church to join us. When we come to take communion, the Churchwardens will invite each row to make their way to the front and stand near the dais for the bread and wine to be served. Gluten free wafers are available on request.

If you are not sure whether communion is right for you, you may either remain in your seat, or if you wish to go up to the rail, the Clergy will be pleased to pray for you. In this situation, please make it clear that you are not expecting them to serve communion to you, by not holding your hands out to receive the sacraments.

Am I expected to contribute?

We are delighted that you have come, and we want you to feel very free to enjoy your time with us. We are funded by the regular members and are not looking to visitors to help fund our services. We want you to enjoy the refreshments after the service so that we can get to know you a little better and you can get to know us. There is no charge for refreshments. If you wish to make a gift, there are plates and a card machine available.
